## Cemetery fees

### Funeral directors

We expect funeral directors and undertakers to:

- Excavate the grave and, within three months of a burial, level its surface
- Take away any surplus soil from the cemetery
- Maintain and level the grass over the grave for one year after each burial
- Provide a marker on the grave clearly showing the name of the deceased person

### Fees

For rights to a grave or cremation plot, there are fees for villagers and non-resident persons.

A villager is a person who died in the civil parish of Binegar (or in a house outside the parish but within 500m of the boundary) or who had only moved away because of age or infirmity. The Council may also grant villager status to a person who had a close or special relationship with the parish in life.

In an earthen grave	£200
Interment of ashes in a grave plot or cremation plot	£100
Scattering ashes	£50
Permission for memorials and inscriptions	
A headstone, wooden cross, book, scroll or similar	£120
A cremation tablet	£120
A further inscription (after the first)	£50

The Parish Council waives fees for a burial of a villager under 16 years.

There is no charge for transferring ownership of deeds of rights.

Advance purchase of rights to a plot is available only to villagers at a fee of £300 for a grave and £225 for a cremation plot. The Council allocates the actual plot only at the first interment.
